Ladies and Gentlemen.

Good Morning.

It is with great pleasure to come back to the University to participate in yet another Ceremony less than a month since we held the 3rd Graduation Ceremony. The purpose of ceremony this morning is



to launch the University of Embu Strategic Plan 2018-2028 and to join the University Community in celebrating the University's **re-certification** to ISO 9001:2015, Quality Management System (QMS) and **certification** to ISO 27001:2013, Information Security Management Systems (ISMS).

It always gratifying when we have celebrations at the University especially when we are celebrating achievements. Today, even as we celebrate the University's achievements in ISO Quality Management System and Information Security Management System and chart out the future guided by our new Strategic Plan, we must remain conscious of the great challenges that are all over and around us. We are living in difficult





times when the economy is not able to fully support Universities financially in terms of development; which means we have to work harder to generate resources to implement our Strategic Plan.

I must observe that so far we have made significant progress in this University since its establishment and it is our wish that we maintain this tempo with our new Vision 2028.

For us to achieve the strategic objectives of this plan we are launching today, we need to develop a stable and sustainable funding model for the University that compliments government funding – which as we all know might continue dwindling as the years go by. It





is against this background that the University is working on the establishment of an Endowment Fund to be launched very soon. This fund is expected to plug in some fresh resources that will go a long way in improving the University facilities as well as helping needy students to go through their studies with much less difficulties.

On the implementation of the ISO certification for the two standards that we are celebrating today, I must also commend all the staff and the team that was involved in the journey towards certification. The attainment of ISO 9001:2015, Quality Management System (QMS) re-certification and certification to ISO 27001:2013, Information Security Management Systems (ISMS) mirrors the commitment of the University of Embu towards maintaining its reputation for being a University that cares for its customers and stakeholders. In this regard, providing the highest quality of service to our customers will



always be our top priority and we will keep on improving until we attain the highest customer satisfaction rating.

Finally, Ladies and Gentlemen,

Let me conclude by wishing you all the best as we start this journey of implementing our Strategic Plan 2018-2028. I know we will rise to the occasion as we have done in the past; working together towards achieving our goals; supported by the Staff, the Students, the Community, our Well-wishers, and our Stakeholders; together we will make the wise decisions, find common ground, and take bold actions to ensure the success of the University of Embu.
