Today, we have 278 students graduating with various certificates, diplomas and degrees as follows;

- Bachelor's Degrees 253
- Diplomas and Certificates 14
- Master's Degree 11

This is a 126 % increase from our last Graduation Ceremony in 2016 where we graduated 123 students. This shows just how far the University has come from its humble beginnings in 2013. We are proud to have an institution that has developed so well since its establishment.

On behalf of the University Senate and the University Community, I congratulate our graduands very much; you have made us very proud; you maintained peace and stability throughout your stay at the University of Embu, you worked hard; and your parents, families, government and sponsors have sacrificed a lot to get you where you are. Please join me in expressing our great appreciation to those who have helped you reach this far.

Today is a time to think about the YOU who walked here 4 years ago, and the You who will be walking out of the University after this ceremony later today. It is a time to reflect on what you have gained from your studies and chart the way forward for your future. The knowledge and skills you have received will no doubt help you to make a meaningful contribution to society – and in so doing, make a positive difference to the lives of others.

And now, the graduating Class of 2017, you are about to join a second family, the family of University of Embu Alumni. As you leave the University after the ceremony today, as alumni, you will carry the good name of the University with you everywhere you go. Please represent us well.

We wish you the best for the future. I am confident that you will make your lecturers and your University even more proud through your contributions in society, especially by being disciplined, hardworking, innovative and committed in whatever you set out to do in life.

Mr. Chancellor Sir,

We at University of Embu take great pride in our quality market-relevant programmes that have consistently continued to attract students and provide a launching pad for our students into their future.

In addition, even though, we are operating in a very competitive environment, and having to share the playing field with older, bigger and more established universities, we still have been able to attract quality students, staff and researchers. We will continue to strive for excellence in education and research. We are working on multiple fronts to make sure we stay at the top and achieve our plans.

Significant Achievements

Allow me now to highlight some of the major achievements that we have recorded at the University of Embu in the last Academic Year.

- 1. On September 30th 2017, we held the first Graduation Ceremony where our first 123 graduates were conferred with various degrees and awarded certificates and Diplomas.
- 2. On 7th October 2017, the University was awarded a Charter by His Excellency, The President of the Republic of Kenya, after successfully meeting all the regulatory requirements for elevation to a full University status by the Commission for University Education (CUE). This was followed by your appointment as the first ever Chancellor of the new University of Embu.
- 3. Our student population has continued to increase drastically since the first group of 123 students was admitted in 2013. This Academic Year, 2017/2018, the student population stands at 5,591.

Mr. Chancellor Sir, I am glad to inform you and our parents that for the first time during the 2017/2018 intake, out of the 1,400 students who joined UoEm from the 2016 KCSE candidates, more that half, applied to KUCCPS to be admitted to the University of Embu as their **FIRST CHOICE.** This means that despite the relatively short period of existence, the University's impact in the society is already being felt.

- 4. We appreciate our students for the good image that they continue to portray in their conduct and in the good words that they share about the University with their siblings and peers. Mr. Chancellor Sir, As a way of appreciating our students, I am happy to announce today that in addition to the Outstanding Academic Performance Award that has initiated the University has been by you, approved commencement of a postgraduate studies scholarship initiative for University of Embu Graduates. This Scholarship program will begin with the class that is graduating today. Already we have awarded 20 Scholarships to the Best candidates in this class. May I ask the recipients of the Scholarships to rise up so that awe can congratulate them. Thank You.
- 5. On the research front, the University has continued to do very well; our staff are engaged in major research initiatives that have attracted over \$840,000 worth of research grants. The University has also established numerous collaborations and partnerships with major national and international research institutions and the research portfolios of our staff continue to grow and grow, day by day.
- 6. The University has continued to excel in Performance Contracting by recording major achievements and performance rankings since its inception. We have managed to attain the **EXCELLENT** score in

performance contracting for three years in a straight row and we intend to remain that way.

- 7. The University has lived up to the expectations of the Quality Management System of ISO 9001:2008 since 2014 when we got ISO certified. During the last four years, the Kenya Bureau of Standards has continued to conduct surveillance audits and in all the audits, the University was found to be fully compliant and conforming. We are currently in the process of transiting to ISO 9001:2015 and implementing the Information Security Management System (ISMS) ISO 27001:2013 so as to make our institution a better place for all our stakeholders.
- 8. The University has continued to honour its financial obligations and also maintained full compliance to statutory and regulatory requirements.
- 9. In the area of infrastructural development, we have just completed two major facilities that will change the image of this University. These are the Administration Building and the spectacular new New Library.
- 10. On quality Assurance, the University has continued to fair very well in ensuring that all our programmes and operations are compliant to the stipulated standards.

Mr. Chancellor Sir.

In February this year, the Commission for University Education conducted a Quality Audit for all Universities in Kenya. The results indicated that the University of Embu is one of the few Universities in the country that were fully complying with the CUE Regulations and Quality Standards.

11. In the area of academics, we have reviewed our curriculum to reflect the needs of our stakeholders as well as the market trends. We have grown our academic programmes from 8 that we started with in 2013 to 78 fully accredited programmes offered in 2017. Our new School of Nursing admitted its first full time undergraduate students from KUCCPS during this September 2017 intake. We have also continued to attract and retain very highly qualified and experienced staff.

Future plans

I wish to reiterate that in the years ahead, we look forward to having one of the best universities in the region, nationally and internationally. This academic year we will embark on our next project of building an ultramodern Tuition Block which will comprise lecture theatres, lecture rooms and academic offices.

We also have plans of starting the School of Health Sciences in Collaboration with the Embu County Government and the Embu Level 5 Hospital, the School of Hospitality and Hotel Management and the School of Law among others.

With those remarks, I once again appreciate you for gracing our graduation today. I wish you a long life and many blessings so that you can continue guiding us in our efforts to transfer knowledge through teaching, Research and Service to humanity.
