SEMESTER I, 2021/2022 TEACHING AND LEARNING ARRANGEMENTS FOR

**CONTINUING STUDENTS** 

I trust you are well and keeping safe. I am pleased to inform you that teaching and learning for all continuing students (certificate, diploma, undergraduate (2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Year) and postgraduate students for Semester I, 2021/2022 will commence on Monday, 30<sup>th</sup> August, 2021. All continuing students are therefore required to self-activate and register for the semester on 26<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> August, 2021 through the online student's portal.

In an effort to ensure adherence to the Ministry of Health Guidelines on prevention of the spread of COVID-19, the University will continue with the Blended Teaching and Learning Approach (BTLA) adopted in the University for the last two Academic Years. This means that students will be required to attend classes through a combination of online and face to face approach as detailed below;

- 1. All Certificate, Diploma, Postgraduate and 4<sup>th</sup> year Bachelors students will be required to attend face to face classes throughout the semester.
- 2. Students pursuing some selected programmes in 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> year will be required to attend face to face classes throughout the semester as detailed in the table below
- 3. Other Bachelor's groups in 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> year will have 50 % of their learning experience (half of the semester) through online teaching and learning and the remaining 50 % of their learning experience (half of the semester) through face to face as detailed in the table below;
