impeccable record of distinguished public impeccable record of distinguished public service. This is a historic moment for the University as Dr. Gikuhi becomes the first recipient of this great honour.

The honorary degree is one of the highest recognition that the University bestows on individuals of great integrity,

who have made profound and enduring national and international contributions to scholarship, and improved quality of life in society at large. This is in line with the Commission for University Education, Universities Standards and Guidelines, 2014

and the University Statutes.

Dr. Gikuhi has served the Nation of Kenya in various capacities- as a classroom teacher, an administrative officer and a policy director at TSC, a university lecturer and ultimately as the 1st Chairperson of the University of Embu Council. Her leadership or transformed the University of Embu through the development of key infrastructure, and putting in place

iversity of Embu was ranked the Best Performing State Corporation in Kenya during the 2019/2020 Financial Year, Performance Contract cycle for Government Ministries / Departments / Agencies, State Corporations and Tertiary Institutions. This was contained in a report published by the Ministry of Public Service and Gender. The evaluations were done by the Public Service Performance Management and Monitoring Unit through the Government Performance Contracting Information System (GPCIS) between November and December 2020.

Despite the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic which hit the Country in March 2020, while in the second quarter of the performance cycle and the accompanying budget cuts to avail resources for addressing the pandemic, the University of Embu was still able to achieve all its performance targets, thereby clinching the 1st Position as the Best Performing State Corporation. The evaluations serve as one of the Government's strategies for enhancing efficiency and effectiveness in public service delivery. Out of the 223 state corporations whose performance was evaluated, five of them, representing 2.2% attained an *Excellent* Performance Grade, while 23% attained a *Very Good* Performance Grade Another 167 state corporations, representing 74.8% achieved Good, Fair or Poor, hence did not achieve

their performance targets

FRESHERS REPORT FOR 2021/2022 ACADEMIC YEAR

he University of Embu (UoEm) has successfully implemented blended learning in teaching and learning. The University continues to provide effective, flexible, convenient and accessible learning experiences to address the needs of the students. The successful implementation of blended learning is attributed to the visionary leadership of the University Management, the commitment of academic staff and hardworking students. The University has invested heavily on the ICT infrastructure in provision of state-of-the-art hardware, software, and increased internet bandwidth to support online learning. The University has trained academic staff in course content development for virtual environments, the effective use of both UoEm e-Learning Management System (LMS) and UoEm Web Conferencing e-Platform in teaching and

assessment. Training on effective use of the LMS and Web Conferencing e-Platforms for students is continuous. The University has a ODeL and Blended Learning Policy to guide the process

On 12th August, 2021, the University held a Publishing Workshop that brought together all academic members of staff. The Workshop targeted staff, who are also supervisors of postgraduate students.

The Workshop addressed the fundamentals of publishing, guiding postgraduate students through the publication process, emerging issues in student research and publications, data analysis, what editors/reviewers look for, intellectual property, plagiarism and patenting. It is believed that this will improve the UoEm publications as well as research work.

As a strategic approach, members of staff have been looped in the staff training process as internal facilitators to help them build skills, stay up to date with industry changes, and share knowledae

The MoU also allows the University researchers to carry out joint research with medical professionals in an effort towards regulations in the first lead of providing solutions in the field of

medicine.

The University also signed MoUs with the National Cereals and Produce Board (NCPB); and Embu Water and Sanitation Company (EWASCO). The MoUs will see the institutions carry out joint researches as well as secure industrial attachments for the students, particularly those taking Bachelor of Science in Agriculture programme.
