## Good afternoon,

I am happy to join you for this important training on Internal Audit processes. It is important for all of us to note that every auditee should have a positive attitude towards internal audits, as it is meant to make our processes and systems work better.

This is why we must ensure that every Auditee in the University is fully conversant with the audit procedures, reporting and how to respond to audit queries within the stipulated timelines. This training therefore, is yet another opportunity for capacity building for our Heads of Departments, Sections and Units in the University in this area. To illustrate the above, an observation was made during a recent meeting of the University Council, that some Auditees are not able to give satisfactory responses to audit queries raised in their operational areas. To address this challenge, the Council made a recommendation that a training be organized for all Heads of Departments, Sections and Units in the University, who are generally charged with the responsibility of responding to audit findings reports, recommendations or queries. That observation by Council is in fact the genesis of this training.

This training has therefore been organized to help the participants not only to improve on their responses to audit queries whenever they arise but also to understand the entire audit process.

In conclusion, it is my hope that the training will be an eye opener to all of us so that we can be able to appreciate the importance of the Internal Audit function in an institution, as well as the corresponding expectations that come with it. I wish you a fruitful engagement with the facilitator and the auditors. I am confident that we shall all benefit greatly from the training. Ladies and gentlemen,
